- Cornhole Tournament - Ms. Cederholm shared an update on the cornhole tournament. The board provided different ways to help marketing the event. Mr. Richardson shared that he has five gift cards from local business for door prizes.

- Park Appreciation Day – Ms. Leavitt agreed to look into the Great Global Clean-up to see if BG could get involved in this program. The board also brainstormed on proving a list of all the city parks and asking the community to help clean up their own park and send in pictures for a little recognition on our social media platforms.
