Project Description

Federal Request

92nd Ave Sewer Extension Project – Phase II

\$2 million

The City owns, operates, and maintains a sewer system network of 58 miles of gravity and pressure sewer lines along with 12 lift stations. As the City grows, this network must be extended and expanded to support new development. The northwest quadrant of the City contains large amounts of developable employment and residential land, but the existing sewer infrastructure is already near capacity. The 92nd Ave Sewer Extension Project would complete approximately two miles of improvements from 92nd Ave to SR 503, unlocking approximately 190 Acres for private development. Project components include the construction of a new pump station, new force main and upsizing existing force main.

Phase I of the project – which includes construction of the new pump station – is underway and begins construction in February 2023. The City is seeking funding for Phase II, which involves construction of approximately 0.5 miles of force main from SW 20th Avenue to SR 503 and 0.75 miles of gravity main in SR 502. Phase II will extend a parallel force main for an existing pump station and converting a second pump station to gravity flow to the new 92nd Avenue Pump Station, providing desperately needed additional capacity in the area.

Eaton Boulevard Improvement Project

\$4 million

The City of Battle Ground is seeking federal funding for the reconstruction of SW Eaton Boulevard between SW 20th Avenue and SR 503, a corridor comprised of the City's highest accident locations. The primary purpose of the project is to bring the roadway up to the City's Minor Arterial Standards, which will significantly increase safety by including a center turn lane and separating bike lanes and sidewalks from traffic. Additionally, a signal will be installed at SW 20th Avenue and additional turn lanes at the intersection with SR 503. Federal funding would complement over \$3.5 million in state and local funding for the project.

Battle Ground Downtown Revitalization

\$500,000

The City is requesting \$500,000 to complete engineering and design of its Main Street Revitalization Project. The City's main thoroughfare, East Main Street, offers visitors and residents access to restaurants, shopping, professional services, parks and recreation, hotel accommodation, and City and community services, including the Battle Ground Community Center and City Hall. The street is also centrally located to Battle Ground High School and within walking distance of multifamily housing. Main street programs enhance the economic vitality of cities while improving residents' quality of life, increasing accessibility, walkability, and expanding use of public space. Planning work is underway and the requested funding will allow the City to complete engineering and design necessary to make the project shovel ready. Anticipated improvements include widening existing sidewalks, moving utilities underground, widening the street, and expanding opportunities for parking. In addition to street improvements, the Main Street Revitalization project would also include

improvements to the City's Fairground Park, located at the end of East Main Street. The park is home to the Battle Ground Community Center, the City's award-winning skatepark, and baseball/softball fields.

In Development...

Force Main Construction

\$40 million

Sanitary sewer waste from the City of Battle Ground currently travels 9 miles through a 16-inch force main on its way to the Salmon Creek Treatment Plant. The capacity of this force main is expected to be reached between 2032 and 2035 due to the continuing growth of the City. The City is planning to construct a parallel 24-inch force main prior to capacity being reached. Future funding of this project would allow for the City to continue to grow for the next 50 years.
